### General principle:

Notes to be used in evidence should be:

- 'contemporaneous' (made at the time), or
- compiled <u>as soon as possible</u> after the event

#### Section 139, Criminal Justice Act 2003

A person giving evidence in criminal proceedings may refresh his memory from a document made earlier if he confirms:

- the document records his recollection of events, and
- recollection likely to be better then, than when giving evidence
