# What did we set out to do?

- In June 2002, we agreed to support a proposal to develop a database of 3<sup>rd</sup> party infringements for UK pipelines, specifically:
  - To collate and analyse infringements suffered by UKOPA members
  - To provide UKOPA and its members with meaningful data to influence third parties and the HSE
  - To categorise infringements by severity and proximity to support RAWG activities

# How are we doing?

- ‘To collate and analyse infringements suffered by UKOPA members’
  - We now have a database of ca. 1800 records provided by the majority (all?) members
  - Involvement of NGT (and their commitment to the process) has been a significant step
  - We now have a tool which can be interrogated in a range of ways, providing real and meaningful data on infringement

# How are we doing?

- ‘To provide UKOPA and its members with meaningful data to influence third parties and the HSE’
  - The power of the database is such that the HSE now use it’s findings on infringement to drive inspections
  - Follow-ups to date by the HSE include United Utilities and BT
  - The United Utilities follow-up has seen a step change in the response and commitment of this multi-utility company

# How are we doing?

- To categorise infringements by severity and proximity to support RAWG activities
  - The database is now beginning to generate statistically meaningful information
  - The challenge is to continue to develop the dataset without making our data submission too complex or onerous
  - One proposal for consideration today is to add a further input to record whether an infringement was pre-notified

# We have been really successful!

- The database activity has resulted in:
  - Strong support from Steve Wing and HSE's Gas & Pipelines Unit and a further recognition of the value of an effective industry association
  - Formation of the UKOPA Infringement Working Group, with HSE membership providing valuable publicity and 'encouragement' – undoubtedly supported by the Fluxsys incident
  - UKOPA information feeding directly into HSE excavator/utility inspection programmes – the database provides HSE with the means to target their (limited) resources at those posing the greatest risk to our pipelines

# We have been really successful!

- The database activity has resulted in:-
  - An invitation to present to a BT national contractors safety forum
  - An HSE proposal to make an input to 'Utility Week' – HSE suggest drafting an article and having it issued under the UKOPA banner?
  - An invitation to present a paper at European ethylene pipeline conference – opportunity to influence European pipeline safety instrument?
  - Direct influence of national pipeline safety regulation at a very practical level - we did this together, through the simple step of pooling our data!


# Current Activities & Issues

- Proposals from last Infringement Working Group:
  - Issue an annual infringement database report via the open section of the UKOPA website
  - Run a seminar (two centres?) targetting the 'top 20' infringers to involve them in discussion with us & HSE
  - Combine with NGT asset protection forum (thanks to HSE for this proposal) - HSE may then run a follow-up to their 2005 inspection programme, focussing on same companies and themes

# Current Activities & Issues


- Proposals from last Infringement Working Group:
  - UKOPA members to complete a simple communications matrix – what are we individually doing well that could be shared and made common?
  - Develop and publish a common (UKOPA) DVD on excavation safety, identifying the basics and focussing on ‘don’t dig our pipelines up!’
  - Develop an excavation safety section on UKOPA website

## Infringements by Category May 2005




# Infringements by Location


## May 2005




## Infringements by Activity May 2005
