

PSWG Remit

- Annual Process Safety Review Questionnaire and prepare findings report**
- Conduct 2-yearly PSAT survey and prepare report**
- To produce or update Good Practice Guides and Safety Bulletins with a process safety bias.**
- Update the UKOPA Process Safety Good Practice Guide**
- Issue Safety Alerts and Incident Awareness Raising**

Process Safety Review Questionnaire

- Submitted every year. Request for 2016 just issued for return by 30 Oct 17
- 17 boxes to complete – should take approx. 30 minutes to complete
- 2015 findings were presented in February
- Of the 11 categories, the ‘responsible’ Working Group split is as follows; ERWG 2, PIWG 4, IWG 2, FARWG 2, PSWG 1
- PSWG Responsibility – Safety Alerts

Process Safety Discussion

- In order to identify future work areas, members were requested to identify key process safety concerns
- The list is currently being compiled and finalised but at the meeting approx. 25 issues were identified
- Many issues raised will be for distribution to the other Working Groups but there will be some for the PSWG to consider – relating to safety culture, KPIs, leadership, communication, etc
- Next steps are to complete the list, categorise and distribute to WGs and for PSWG to agree the top three priorities for PSWG attention

2016 PSAT Results and Reports (1)

- 2016 PSAT was completed early in 2017 and a summary presented at the May Technical Conference**

- Following detailed analysis it is apparent that;
the 2016 results do not differ significantly from 2014
no meaningful conclusions to report (as a whole)**

- Therefore, it is recommended that a formal report is not issued
but remains a draft in the PSAT folder in the Members Centre**

2016 PSAT Results and Reports (2)

- However, individual data has been issued to each member company with comparisons to the UKOPA average, minimum & maximum.
- Companies are encouraged to review their own data and take appropriate action where necessary.
- The report format (spread-sheet) could be made more user-friendly and this is on the action list for 2018

Safety Alerts

- A discussion was held regarding Safety Alerts. There are several issues;**
 - Very few are being forwarded**
 - The ones that are are not pipeline specific**

- A proposal is that one or more Safety Alerts are discussed at the beginning of each WG meeting using a simple UKOPA format or even just a photo or one-page summary. This would then hopefully generate at least 10 to 15 Safety Alerts per year.**

- The UKOPA secretariat at each WG could then collate the information shared. PSWG would then put them into a standard UKOPA format and present a selection at the Technical Conference and Members meetings.**

Land at Bromborough exchanged ownership at auction without Essar knowledge. The new land-owner then proceeded to rapidly clear the site without any consent. A bonfire was then built above the pipelines. Fortunately, the activity was picked-up via surveillance and Essar was able to intervene before the fire was lit. Close surveillance has been required since, including security patrols.


Root Cause – new landowner cleared site without any permissions (either from Essar or Council)

Lessons Learnt
1. Monitor potential sale of land via auction house lists. Check for 'For sale' signs
2. Maintain surveillance

PSWG

The Process Safety Working Group (PSWG) consists of UKOPA members interested in process safety and developing information for sharing to the wider UKOPA membership.

The group meets 3-4 times per year at various member company sites or via teleconference.

The PSWG are responsible for meeting the strategy objectives of UKOPA with regards to Process Safety and on an annual basis is responsible for producing the UKOPA Process Safety Indicator report and encouraging the sharing of Safety Alerts. On a 2-yearly basis the group manage, collate and share the results and findings of the Process Safety Assessment Tool questionnaire.

PSWG produced (and on a regular basis review) the UKOPA Good Practice Guide 003 Managing Pipeline Safety Monitoring.
