



PSWG Remit

- Annual Process Safety Review Questionnaire and prepare findings report**
- Conduct 2-yearly PSAT survey and prepare report**
- To produce or update Good Practice Guides and Safety Bulletins with a process safety bias.**
- Update the UKOPA Process Safety Good Practice Guide**
- Issue Safety Alerts and Incident Awareness Raising**

Process Safety Review Questionnaire

- Submitted every year. Request for 2016 just issued for return 30 Oct 17
- 17 boxes to complete – should take approx. 30 minutes to complete
- Submissions were not chased, and so report yet to be prepared. 2016 reports requested by Mid March for report completion by end of March 2018.
- Request for 2017 data to be sent out in April 2018.

PSAT Feasibility Study

- At the last members meeting, the view of the members in attendance was that the biennial PSAT survey should continue**
- The tool has now reached the end of its current life and a feasibility study is to be conducted to identify what are the possible options for replacement**
- PSWG want to establish how members are currently using the data they obtain from the tool, what other functionality they would like to see and how the data should be presented - please take the time to provide your thoughts and feedback to Nikki Barker when she contacts you regarding this.**
- Once the study is completed, the group will look to engage a company to develop a system for future use.**

Safety Alerts

- New template has been prepared**
- Sign on from a number of the working groups to provide data and have this transformed into Alerts**
- Focus to be on pipeline issues, rather than 'general' alerts**
- Please engage and inform PSWG of incidents and learnings that can be shared.**

Members Issues for identifying Future Workload

- ❑ In October 2017 members were requested to identify the top 5 issue for their companies.
- ❑ Collated and circulated, then reviewed at the February meeting
- ❑ Of the 50 items identified (some were duplicates) over 20 were considered to be issues that fitted better with the other workings groups and these are to be passed across.
- ❑ 9 subjects were considered to be areas that the PSWG should look at further and 2 were to be passed to the Board for their consideration.
- ❑ At the May meeting a mini workshop is to be held to identify a programme of work, if required (and not covered elsewhere)
 - ❑ Behaviour Safety / Safety Culture / Process Safety Leadership
 - ❑ Human Performance / Human Factors / Competence
 - ❑ PS KPIs
 - ❑ Process Hazard Reviews
 - ❑ Management of Change

Process Safety Forum

- ❑ **PSWG** represent UKOPA on the National Process Safety Forum (made up of representatives from many trade associations and industry bodies – not just pipeline focused). More information can be found at their website www.p-s-f.org.uk
- ❑ Meet 3 times a year to provide a platform whereby initiatives, good practice, lesson from incident and process safety strategy can be distilled and shared across sectors
